Will finalize bylaws and vote on them at next meeting. Wilson, Family Healthcare <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Is reaching out to its chronically ill patients to ensure they have needed support, medication, provider contact, etc. o We are seeing well-patient pediatric patients for immunizations and other appointments in the morning and we are providing additional space and time. o We are also providing screening and treatment for potentially contagious folks (strep, flu, COVID-19, etc.) in a safe, more isolated area. Telehealth continues where appropriate as well.
