Subcommittee Reports

- Wellness/Lifestyle Committee Cindy Earle
 - The group has been looking at activation and evaluation over the past month.
 - A train the trainer event took place at the YMCA with Meritus. Cooking demos are scheduled.
 - Kellogg's is looking at an activation at the Meritus Farmer's Market in a few weeks. Samples
 and recipes will be shared to help people incorporate the items they buy into their meal plan.
 - There have been some vending opportunities at Walgreens monthly Senior Days and the Walmart Health Expos that are held on Saturdays.
 - Looking at how they can incorporate some medication adherence processes into events.
 - o Katie Trinh reminded the group of the online Google Calendar that lists Walgreens, Martins and Walmart events. Katie will send the link to any community organizations that would like to get involved. Flyers for events can be downloaded/uploaded. Infographics that were created for One for Good are also available to help encourage healthier behaviors. This is

- One for Good t-shirts and buttons are available.
- Martins has decided not to sell any nicotine products and is promoting smoking cessation classes. Martins is also doing Wellness Walks. They are working with Meritus and other health systems to bring patients in to do a tour and talk with a nutritionist about any questions or concerns they may have. A flyer and schedule have been posted.
- Prime Time for Women is encouraging people in the community to post blogs and articles on health and fitness. Please feel free to post and use the information.
- Martins and Walgreens pharmacists are promoting health and wellness. They are able to provide consultations (i.e. medication adherence, smoking cessation, etc.).

- Health Management Deb Lehr
 - Meritus Outpatient Care Management has some stop light instructions for heart disease, blood pressure and diabetes. They are a helpful tool for patients. The group will be working with PCP offices over the next year or so to review and use these tools.

- Behavioral Health Allen Twigg, Curtis Miller and Patty Smith
 - Substance abuse and mental health were identified as the top two community health needs.
 - The group wants to work on improving three areas over the next few years:
 - Preventing suicide Washington County has a higher rate of successful suicide than much of the rest of the state.
 - Reduce stigma around both of these issues.
 - ✓ Walk Out of Darkness campaign will be coming up this fall which brings awareness around suicide and how to get help when needed.
 - ✓ Washington County Goes Purple has done a lot to reduce sigma around substance abuse and bringing awareness to the issue. Washington County Goes Purple will be incorporating mental health as part of their initiative this year.
 - ✓ Will continue to provide Mental Health First Aid training, which is free. Everyone is encouraged to sign-up if you have not done so already.
 - ✓ Brooke Lane has partnered with the library to bring programs to the public. Two programs are scheduled in May. One will address anxiety, the other depression.
 - Increase access to treatment, support and resources whenever needed.
 - ✓ A RFP has been issued through the health department for a crisis stabilization center which will be a 24/7 walk-in facility for those needing help. Information can be found on the health departments website. Applications are due May 24th.

 - Special enrollment period is a sixty-day window to report major life changing events.
 - Still assisting with printing and providing 1095's for taxes. Some individuals have had to pay monies back due to having an employer offering them coverage when they were on MD Health Connection the entire year, resulting in them having to pay back the full amount of the subsidy. If an employer offers insurance that is their top option.

 - May 17th will be the annual meeting/public hearing at 1:30pm, everyone is welcome to attend.
 - Participating in Washington County Gives, which is extra important this year since they will be cut \$15,000 in nutrition services. The Meals on Wheels wait list for medically bound seniors is between 40-80 people at any given time.

The group meets in the mornings and has an average attendance of 40-60 people per day 7 days per week. So they have reach approximately 500 people this year who are struggling with substance use.
